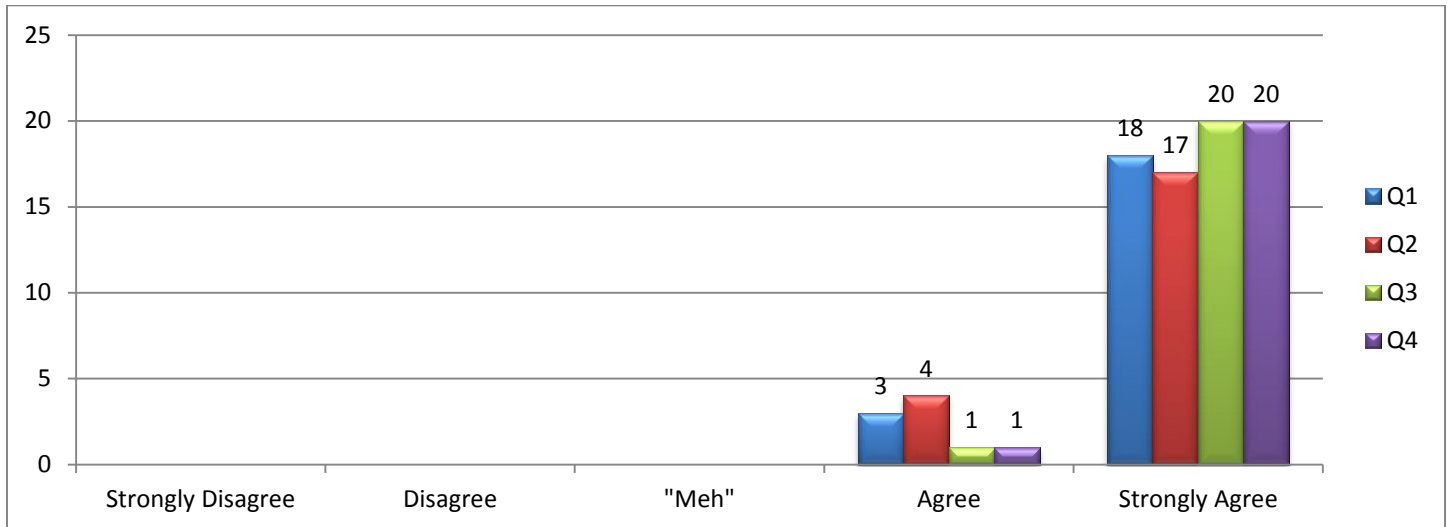
Tobin, “Secret Boss Training: How to Observe and Evaluate Teaching”
