

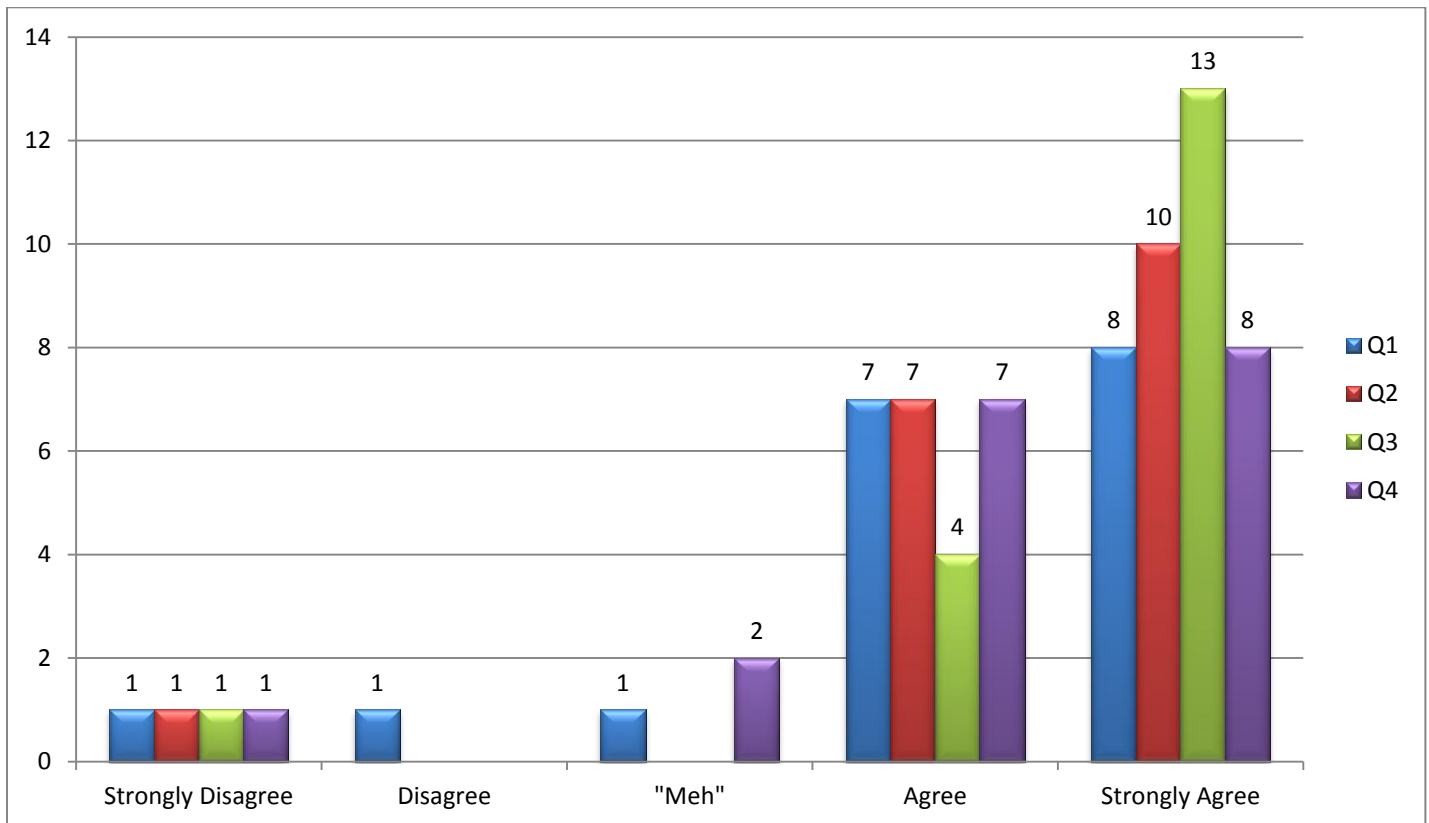


Tobin, “Starting Your Universal Design for Learning Project” Workshop
