- Try the +1 in policy class I use a lot of the PBS educational videos on basic civics. Taking screen shots and putting them into a PPT will help the student to study from them.
- Shorter videos
- Include choices if possible
- I do not teach regularly, however I'm working on a CE offering this gives me new ideas for this planning and implementation. Thank you!
- All the 5 strategies for designing text, alternatives, demonstration of ways learners learn, chunking contents and sharing interactions
- The "add 1" strategy to give more options. Also, creating 6-minute videos rather than 1 hour
- 1+ 1 strategy. Put "time" into assignments needed



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- I plan to make short segments (10-2) in class to provide a time for connection with the material.
- Make the students pick how they will meet the objective/complete the assignment. Making short 10 minute video instead of the long 30 minute lecture.
- Try the +1. Breaking up PowerPoint to be shorter multiple PP. Add text/comment into PP. Check into textbooks if they have other forms of the content.
- Making short lecture segments for online learning as mentioned 10 minute bursts of information rather than an hour long audio lecture.
- Using how Dr. Tobin role modeled this presentation will be used to enhance my teaching. The session went so fast! I will be adding some of his engaging strategies.
