



- There was a lot of reiteration of good reminders of things we have learned in the past—the reminder to don't forget to always engage, even if it means you may miss covering something or students won't remember the something anyway.

- Think where students are when they are preparing to engage with you.
- Try one more thing.
- Trying to add +1 to approach to make learning more accessible to the students.
